



Destination must-knows

Pioneering spirit, the birthplace of French skiing

The **first Winter Olympic Games** were held in **Chamonix** in 1924. That same year, France's first-ever cable car, nicknamed "the Glaciers", was built. Then, in **1933**, the **first cable car** dedicated **exclusively to winter sports** opened in **Megève**.

The first French ski instructor, a legend from Megève, **Émile Allais**, was **the first-ever French Alpine ski medal winner** (triple World Champion in Chamonix in 1937). Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc, the heartland of skiing, is also a playground for champions of all disciplines.

A string of resort-villages

Haute-Savoie totals some **42 ski resorts**, **95% of which are resort-villages** inhabited all year round, boasting well-preserved traditions and unspoilt natural surroundings. **Good to know**: some are linked to the major ski areas such as the Portes du Soleil and the Grand Massif and feature Avoriaz and Flaine on their heights with their arty style.

Great virtuous, GREEN skiing

Whooshing through forests, "among the pines" is what all Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc resorts have in common. Whether they're small and neighbourly or large and trendy, all Haute-Savoie resorts are inherently committed to protecting their nature through virtuous initiative. 10 Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc resorts have also rolled out an ecological transition process (Flocon Vert (Green Snowflake) label).

A learning playground

Several resorts, perfect for the little ones through their infrastructure and their mindset, illustrate that Haute-Savoie pursues its route as a **mountain** area for learning and for hosting school ski trips, as well as holiday camps.

The closest Alps to Paris

4h45: is the time it takes to travel by train to reach the peaks of the Aravis resorts (Le Grand-Bornand, La Clusaz and Manigod) via Annecy (coach);
4h30 to get to Combloux and just a few minutes more to venture into the Pays du Mont-Blanc (Cordon, Saint-Gervais, Megève and Praz-sur-Arly).
Count 5hto journey to Alpes du Léman and Chablais resorts.
A Paris-Saint-Gervais, ski-in, ski-out? The Alpin gondola lift, directly linked to the Valléen (departure from Saint-Gervais Le Fayet train station), provides direct access to the slopes at 1,400 m altitude in about ten minutes:
an innovation and the first of its kind in Europe.



8 LINKED, SKI-IN, SKI-OUT ALPINE SKI AREAS

• The Portes du Soleil: France's 2nd largest ski area. From its charming little villages to its well-known pedestrian resort of Avoriaz, this area stands out with its cross-border aspect (12 resorts in France and Switzerland) and its 600 km made for roaming through snow-filled forests, Alpine peaks and breathtaking panoramas. On the French side: Avoriaz, Châtel, Les Gets, Morzine-Avoriaz, La Chapelle d'Abondance are all ski-in, ski-out linked the and Saint-Jean d'Aulps resort-village can be reached by shuttle.

• The Grand Massif: France's 5th largest ski area (365 km of slopes). With its 139 slopes covering all colour grading (25 green, 59 blue, 44 red and 11 black), this area connects several resorts and villages (Les Carroz, Samoëns, Flaine, etc.) and boasts an across-the-board range of activities (Alpine, freestyle, Nordic, ski touring, snowboarding, parasport).

• Évasion Mont-Blanc: 400 km shared between the resorts of Megève, Saint-Gervais-les-Bains/Saint-Nicolas-de-Véroce. The Évasion Mont-Blanc area invites to enjoy fantastic ski sensations in unspoilt natural surroundings with incredible scenescapes.

• The Portes du Mont-Blanc: 100 km of slopes overlooking Mont-Blanc. The Portes du Mont-Blanc area covers four resort-villages: Combloux, Megève, La Giettaz (neighbouring the Aravis mountains).

• **Espace des Lys:** 60 km between mountain pastures and forests with a vista over Mont-Blanc. Espace des Lys, perched at a height of 1,500 metres, comprises the family-style **Praz de Lys** and **Sommand** resorts. A natural setting with panoramas over Mont-Blanc, just 15 minutes from Cluses.

Hirmentaz and Les Habères are two resorts located close by, at just 30 minutes from Annemasse and Thonon-les-Bains. This is where local people learn to ski and holidaymakers enjoy the simplicity and naturalness. From the top of the Hirmentaz slopes:




4. Regional treasures & traditions



Ski patroller for a day


Haven't we all dreamt of being the first to ski down the slopes? Well, dream come true in **Manigod**, as well as in **Praz-sur-Arly** and **Morzine**. A meet-up before the slopes open where you can leave your 'ski tracks' along with the ski patrollers and find out all about their fascinating, highly-demanding job. On the agenda: a tour of the ski area with the patrollers and making a slope safe before giving the green light for a day's skiing. A chance of a lifetime.


"Jump on-board my snow groomer"

As night falls, when the skiers have left the ski areas, the snow groomers take to the stage to get the playground ready for the following day. **Habères, Passy** and **Manigod** ski areas invite you to jump on-board a snow groomer. An explanation of the ins and outs of the job, how the equipment works and hands-on experience are all on the agenda. A snow groomer is presented in **Les Carroz** once a week as part of the winter activities.

Let it snow...

And, while in **Manigod**: a **trip to the snow factory,** to become an expert in snowmaking and the snowmaker's job. The aim: to learn how this snow is created using only air and water.

Ski touring

With its pristine, wild, unspoilt nature, Haute-Savoie is the perfect place to enjoy ski touring and its proven benefits.

Try it out in valleys like Môle, Arve, Sulens and Thônes.

The Gypaète Trail to begin with

The route in **Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval** is specifically designed with novices in mind and offers an initiation into ski touring (organized by the French Ski School (ESF) in Morillon, whose instructors are also authorized to supervise outings too).

Learn the bases of ski touring from the age of 8

Le Grand-Bornand offers supervised 3-hour mountain discovery sessions along marked routes on the periphery of the ski area. The programme includes how to put seal skins on and learning about the mountain environment and its limitations from the instructor, followed by a demonstration of avalanche search techniques using a shovel, probe and avalanche transceiver.


Ski touring by night

The **"Échappée Rando"** (ski touring escapade) has been highly popular for some 6 years now in **Combloux**. Sessions organized during the end-of-year and February half-term holidays (and open to everyone) take participants from Le Cry to the top of Beauregard, before heading back down via groomed slopes.

Save the date for a Tuesday or Friday evening for a supervised ski touring outing in **Saint-Gervais**.

Ski touring and a night in a refuge

Climbing with skins on your skis is the (only) way to reach the refuges open during winter and to delight in an overnight stay that's like a moment out of time. Discover the **Cabane du Col de Coux in Morzine** (renovated), from the Manche Valley, **La Golèse refuge in Samoëns** and **La Pointe Percée refuge in Le Grand-Bornand**.



A 100% ski touring weekend

The **Alpes du Léman** Tourist Office has concocted an "all-inclusive" (with a night in a hotel) and two days to learn and improve ski touring skills in unspoilt landscapes.

A new dedicated festival

La Trace Festival (Thônes), is the 1st French ski touring film festival: 16 films in competition, 1 trade show, covering 300 m², devoted to ski touring, specialized stands, an Awards ceremony. This festival brings together sector professionals and is intended for aficionados and novices alike, as well as for anyone seeking wonder, thrills and adventure.

Ski touring events

- Edelweiss (mid-February in Megève): nighttime ski touring race. 4 routes to choose from, ranging from 750 m D+ to 1,600 m D+.
- La Crève-Cœur x Völkl (Combloux): nighttime ski touring race. 2 steep climbing routes, one 5.8 km - 730 m D+, the other 3.9 km - 570 m D+.
- Monstre Belle (January in Cordon): nighttime ski touring race. 2 routes (600 m D+ and 900 m D+), over the Frébouge ski area on top of the Herney mountain pasture. Worth noting: Monstre Belle and Raide (March 2026): a one-of-a-kind mountaineering "race" that combines cycling, skiing and mountaineering.
- La Trace des Grands (7 and 8 March 2026
 Chamonix): a choice of three trails, for beginners, avid ski tourers and competitive racers
- Assaut du Haut Fleury (7 January 2026
 Praz de Lys Sommand): night-time skimountaineering race to reach the top of Haut Fleury (1,980 m).
- **Pointes Blanches** (8 February 2026 Praz de Lys Sommand): day race at dawn (elite) along the peaks.



An atmosphere filled with wonder, incredible magic... every year, Santa Claus makes his rounds of all the resorts, towns and villages. And, that's only normal as his hamlet is to be found in Haute-Savoie...

The first snowflakes...

Haute-Savoie ski resorts traditionally open for the end-of-year holiday season. Some of them, the highest (**Flaine, Avoriaz, Chamonix** as well as **La Clusaz/Balme sector**) have surprises in store one or two weekends before Christmas, depending on the amount of snowflakes that fall.

A dazzling Advent

Save the date for two highly-original light events that follow in the Christmas market spirit.

• Turning on the Megève Christmas tree lights. For 50 years now, a giant Christmas tree (20 metres high, comprising some 274 fir trees) has been reigning on the village square, adorned by a leading jewellery house. Save the date for 6 December at 7pm.

• "Saint-Gervais Mont-Blanc lights" (23-31 December). Following in the footsteps of the well-known Festival of Lights in Lyon, when night sets in, Saint-Gervais centre stages its spectacular illuminations along a one-of-a-kind artistic winter route that hosts contemplative and acoustic installations.

A dash of tradition

Christmas "r'zeules": Rissoles are THE must-eat Christmas pastry in Haute-Savoie! The first recipes date back to the 15th century; they've been hand down through the generations. In Aviernoz near Annecy, (village where they originated), rissoles are filled with dried plum paste. In Cruseilles, they're garnished with pear compote with grapes. In Habère-Poche, they're preferred with apples and/or pears. What's more, Martine Desbiolles, alias L'Irmande (her nickname), an iconic figure in the Alpes du Léman region, won the "13H fête Noël 2022" regional recipe competition.

When Christmas creates a buzz

On top of the traditional festivities, **Bonjour l'Hiver** ("Hello Winter" street arts festival, 6-24 December 2025 in Annemasse), **Christmas Celebrations** in Sallanches (6 December 2025-4 January 2026), **Le Big Barouf du Père Noël** ("Santa Claus's Big Bash" in Bonneville), **Les Pestacles du Père Noël** (Street art festival in La Clusaz - over the Christmas week), **Le Père Noël habite aux Gets** ("Santa Claus lives in Les Gets" 19-26 December).

The Fabulous Village or the Legend of the Flottins in Évian

The Flottins, a group of small imaginary people, have been taking over the town of Évian every winter for the past 18 years, transforming it with tons of driftwood carried to Lake Geneva. The only cultural event of its kind in France, organized by the Toupine Theatre (Au Bohneur des Mômes Festival).

Christmas in the mountains

All Haute-Savoie resorts glitter with a thousand colours for Christmas.

- In Flaine: performances, choirs, torch-lit ski descents, visits from Santa Claus and drone shows.
- From Christmas to Epiphany, the festive spirit takes over **Le Grand-Bornand** square (fairground rides, performances, wooden games, craft market, Santa Claus, etc.).
- · In Passy, Santa Claus even rides in a dog sled.

Animated cultural sites to visit

The Grand Parc d'Andilly and Santa's Hamlet (see opposite). Magic happens on the shores of Lake Annecy, where the Château de Menthon-Saint-Bernard renamed Santa Claus Castle for the occasion is also a must-see, while the Ecomuseum of Lake Annecy invites to delight in a Savoie-style Christmas!

Did you know? Santa Claus lives in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc! Santa has set up his Hamlet in Saint-Blaise, on the Mount Sion pass to be precise, between Annecy and Geneva. Here, in this little realm, deep in the heart of a 5-hectare forest, we also come across Mrs Claus, the elves and Father Whipper! The Grand Parc d'Andilly, 4th most visited site in Haute-Savoie, is the only place in the world where the Nutcracker has a house and where you can wander through the longest hanging maze in Europe that's accessible in winter and without a harness.

BMW IBU Biathlon World Cup

Annecy-Le Grand-Bornand (15-21 December 2025): The French stage of the Biathlon World Cup will once again thrill the Sylvie Becaert International Stadium. 4 days of competition, 6 rounds, 300 biathletes, 30 nations.



Ascending the Aiguille du Midi: France's highest cable car

The Aiguille du Midi (3,842 m) cable car, inaugurated in 1955, whisks visitors and mountaineers up to the gateway to the high peaks and to Mont-Blanc in less than 30 minutes. Some people enjoy the 360° panoramic views over the Mont-Blanc range of mountains and the Alps once there, while others put on their ice grippers, skis on their back, ready to whoosh down the White Valley...

Excursion to the Mer de Glace: France's largest glacier

The natural Mer de Glace site, 7 km long, covering 40 km², 200 m thick, at a height of 1,913 m, was formed by the Leschaux and Géant glaciers. In 1741, two Englishmen, Windham and Pocock, disregarded local superstitions and became the first to visit the famous Chamonix Valley "glaciers", believed back then to be dens for demons. Despite dire predictions, they came back down alive and described what they called the Mer de Glace (Sea of Ice) for the first time. The Mer de Glace, illustrating the changes in the Alpine climate, is a prime observation site for learning more about glacial dynamics and contemporary environmental challenges.

Journey to the Mer de Glace

on-board the Montenvers Train

The Mer de Glace has been a must-do excursion in Chamonix Valley since 1741! This site, which was once accessible by mule, attracted wellknown figures in their days: William Turner (1801), François-René de Chateaubriand (1805), Georges Byron (1816), Mary Shelley (1816), Victor Hugo (1825), Alexandre Dumas (1832), Charles Dickens (1846), Louis Pasteur (1860), to name but a few. Since 1909, a little rack-railway train takes visitors up to Montenvers (1913 m), overlooking the Mer de Glace: in other words, 20 minutes of a legendary journey. Once there, visitors continue their discovery on the panoramic terrace, in the ice grotto, Galciorium and interpretation spaces, which immerse them totally in the world of glaciers.

The Refuge du Montenvers is an incomparable, unclassifiable, one-of-a-kind hotel. Stylish, elegant with wood and leather from the times, and steeped in history. When it first opened (1880), its guests were the first visitors to the Mer de Glace, mountaineers, adventurers and artists. Today, it is favoured by epicureans in search of the extraordinary. Nothing in the world compares to waking up with a vista over the Drus and the Mer de Glace and listening to the silence of an immaculate range of mountains. The 18 rooms and suites (and dormitory for 10) are named after illustrious figures, and add a dash of poetry to this moment out of time.

Where can you ski with views over Mont-Blanc?

In the Pays du Mont-Blanc, of course

In **Saint-Gervais**, the Chateluv is a wonderful green slope (4 km) between forests and clearings, with an uninterrupted view of the peaks. IN **Chamonix***, the most experienced skiers will glide down the slopes with ease while admiring Mont-Blanc at the same time, by heading off along the black Charles Bozon slope in the Brévent ski area. In Cordon, nicknamed "Mont-Blanc's balcony", by whooshing along the red Croix slope. In **Combloux**, the vista from the blue (Croix) slope is a must that's accessible to everyone and doesn't require any special technical skills. In Megève, the Gypaète (Christomet - the Portes du Mont-Blanc area) is recommended for the wow factor.

The entire ski area of **Les Contamines-Montjoie** enjoys a breathtaking view over Mont-Blanc, apart from the Hauteluce sector with its two slopes in the village. The highest slope with a view is the red Aiguille slope, where descents start at an altitude of 2,487 metres. On the other side of the valley, in **Passy Plaine-Joux**: all the slopes offer

Grand Massif ski area

a vista over Mont-Blanc!

For the view when starting out from Morillon, Samoëns or Les Carroz, you need to go to the top of the Coulouvrier chairlift and to the Tête des Saix. In **Flaine**, the Méphisto offers a vista over the entire Mont-Blanc range: the slope begins at Les Platières and runs through a wild mountain pass to reach the Aup de Véran ski area.

The arrival at the top of the Grandes Platières cable car is incredible: Mont-Blanc is within reach of your ski tips!

Portes du Soleil ski areas

Two outstanding spots on the Morzine-Les Gets ski area offer a vista over Mont-Blanc: Ranfoilly platform and Pointe de Nyon with the spectacular Pas de l'Aigle glass footbridge. From this viewpoint at 2,019 metres, ski down the Aigle slope to the Nyon plateau. In Les Gets, on the Super Morzine sector, novices have the opportunity to learn how to ski with a panorama over Mont-Blanc. In the **Super Châtel** sector, a descent from the Morclan on the red Chermillon slope with panoramic views over Chalet Neuf at the top of the drag lifts, then down to Morgins (Switzerland).

In the Aravis

In La Clusaz, the black Balme slope wins hands down for its technical level and its wow-inspiring views. For a 360° panorama over the Alps and Mont-Blanc, head for the top of Mont Lachat, the highest point of the ski area. when in Le Grand-Bornand.

The view is uninterrupted from the Roy chairlift, as well as when skiing down the Haut-Fleury Lac slope.

Above Lake Annecy

The resort of **Le Semnoz** boasts two slopes with vistas over Mont-Blanc: Bucherons and Canyon. The three Nordic skiing loops in the area also offer panoramic views: an unexpected spot, just 20 minutes from the capital of the Haute-Savoie department.

In the Alpes du Léman

In the **Hirmentaz** sector along the red Airelles slope.

Skiing for everyone

40% of Haute-Savoie's territory is covered by forests. Skiing takes place in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc in unspoilt natural environments, even at the very heart of nature reserves, no matter the size of the resort. As such, everyone can fulfil their dream of skiing among the fir trees, just like on a picture postcard. Every resort has its signature slope that weaves its way through the forest.

It's here that everyone learns to ski

As the region's rooted in traditions, skiing for children is made easier in specially-designed ski areas. With its many dedicated kids' snow clubs and ski schools, Haute-Savoie invites children to take their first steps on skis and improve while having fun over the years.

The French Ski School organization (ESF) is celebrating its 80th anniversary! Haute-Savoie boasts 37 French Ski Schools, from the smallest in Mont-Saxonnex (5 instructors) to the largest in Megève with 352 coaches.

Haute-Savoie is also a historic destination for **school ski trips and holiday camps**. Holiday centres that perpetuate the tradition of
community learning, hand-in-hand with specialist associations such as **"La Montagne des Juniors"** (Mountains for the kids), cater for groups of

Ski safari

A day's skiing in Haute-Savoie is like a gentle stroll in the fresh air where you can delight in two major interlinked ski areas. To explore the **Grand Massif**, the ski area app offers two suggested routes (adventurers and explorers) starting out from **Samoëns**. To do a round trip of the Portes du Soleil, you can start off from **Les Gets** with the **Chavanne Express** chairlift, then continue your adventure across the **Nyon** (**Morzine**) sector, followed by **Avoriaz** before heading for the Mosettes Express chairlift and touching down in Switzerland. The return journey includes a trip through **Châtel** with its natural vistas over **Lake Geneva** and **Abondance Valley**, etc.

Home of adaptive skiing

Morillon is a benchmark for winter parasports (since 2003) and access to winter sports for all is top priority. The Tatu Handi Sport association works to ensure the resort becomes even more accessible, particularly for sit-skiing and adaptive skiing. It manages the adaptive sport equipment and works hand-in-hand with the French Ski School (ESF) in Morillon to promote these practices. Last winter, the association purchased a **Gotoski** to offer people with disabilities a "standing skiing" experience. Every year, a winter parasport day (in January) enables people with disabilities and able-bodied skiers to discover the range of possibilities offered at the resort, in a friendly, inclusive atmosphere.

The neighbouring resort, **Samoëns**, also promotes adaptive skiing. The Samoëns Handi Glisse association provides equipment free of charge (**tandemski**, **dualski** and **uniski**) and offers supervision by trained French Ski School (ESF) instructors. The **ski taxi** also enables grandparents who don't ski to accompany their grandchildren on the slopes.

In Le Grand-Bornand, piloted dualski outings are on the agenda – equipment is included and the instructors are specifically trained in adaptive skiing. Nearly all the ski area is accessible to wheelchair skis: most of the ski lifts can be used.







In Combloux (Portes du Mont-Blanc ski area), special facilities provide access to ski lifts specially designed for **uniskis and dualskis**. The Loisirs Assis Évasion association lends most of its equipment (such as **uniskis**, **dualskis**, **Snow'Karts**, **Tandemskis**, etc.) free of charge (with a deposit), in addition to offering pilot training courses.

Starting this winter, French Ski School (ESF) instructors in **Passy** will offer adaptive skiing (**sit skiing, standing skiing** and **tandem**) thanks to the opening of a new **specially-designed chairlift in Plaine-Joux**.


An "Adaptive Skiing Day" is organized every year in **Bellevaux** (Hirmentaz-Les Habères ski area) in January, hand-in-hand with the French Ski School (ESF).

This winter, **Praz de Lys Sommand** will host the **French Adaptive Sports Championship**. This first-time event illustrates the resort's values of inclusion and openness and promises to be an occasion full of thrills and sharing.



The mysterious forest of Zizipanpan, Opoualand, "Ze Quartz Park", Pinguin Park, the Cowboys & Indians slope, Môm'Park, Défi'Môm': these themed slopes and spaces, dotted with gongs, tunnels, bends and games have been imagined to have fun while skiing. Children head off in search of life-size animal shapes hidden along the slope of the Enchanted Marvel educational trail (Morillon).


Haute-Savoie's museums and cultural centres are buzzing with activity all year round and are open during winter. They all offer tours and activity sessions for children. The **Wildlife Museum in Bellevaux**, the **Alpine Museum** (reopening this winter) and **Château des Rubins - Alps Observatory** invite you to learn more about the mountains.

The **ecomuseums** (Lake Annecy, the wood and the forest, fishing and the lake), the **Mountain Museum in Les Houches** and the **Hameau des Alpes** (Hamlet of the Alps) take you on a discovery of Haute-Savoie heritage. Another must-visit is the **Musée de l'Horlogerie et du Décolletage** (Clockmaking, Watchmaking and Screw-machining Museum) in **Cluses**.

Players in Haute-Savoie, aware of the richness of the region's mountains, lakes, forests and picturesque villages, are taking practical initiatives to protect the environment.

A first in France

Saint-Gervais has taken a decisive step forward in its commitment to eco-mobility with the opening of the Valléen (2024), an innovative, eco-friendly urban cable car. It links Le Fayet train station directly to the town of Saint-Gervais, providing a sustainable transport solution open all year round, every day from 7am to 8.30pm. This new alternative to the car aims to reduce road traffic by 25% to the foot of the slopes (Bettex), accessible by the Chatelet cable car (from the centre), at the Valléen arrival point. This system improves accessibility to tourist activities and the ski area. The Saint-Gervais Mont-Blanc ski area is once again combining skiing with ecology by offering a 10% discount on day passes for all visitors arriving at Le Fayet by regional train (TER) or by the Léman Express train.

Better transport and great deals in Chamonix Valley

The Mont-Blanc Express train serves all the villages: on the French side, it goes to Saint-Gervais-les-Bains - Le Fayet via Les Bossons, Les Houches and Servoz; on the Swiss side, it goes to Martigny via Les Praz, Argentière and Vallorcine. The SNCF line from Servoz to Vallorcine is free for holders of the Guest Card, which is issued on arrival by the accommodation provider. The Guest Card also entitles you to discounts on Chamonix Mobilité bus tickets, museums, sports facilities, etc.

Car-sharing across the Léman Mountains Explore area

The Karos app can be used to organize car-sharing for Léman resorts. Seasonal shuttle buses also operate between **Abondance Valley** and, on the Lake Geneva side, between Évian and the resorts of **Bernex** and **Thollon-les-Mémises**.



Shared soft mobility

Since April 2025, **Combloux** has had a **self-service car** from the Citiz network, parked in the Cristaux car park. This service, launched hand-in-hand with the Pays du Mont-Blanc Community of Municipalities, allows you to rent an electric vehicle for a few hours, a day or more, with ease.

... the quickest, the cheapest and even a customized one..., this is what the new **GO LES CARROZ** platform, the new mobility companion, promises. This innovative solution combines all modes of transport (air, bus, train, taxi, etc.) on a single website.

New, more eco-friendly ski lifts

In Châtel, the TC10 is replaced by a chairlift that meets environmental conditions: cable traction by a **clean, silent motor**, reduced energy consumption and no hydrocarbon consumption.

Photovoltaic panels installed The resort of Avoriaz has equipped its ski lifts with these panels to make them more energy self-sufficient. This eco-friendly initiative reduces external electricity consumption and helps move towards a more sustainable, more environmentally-aware process. In Les Carroz, the departure station for the Kédeuze cable car and the building housing the rail tobogganing are equipped with photovoltaicpanels that supply energy for the rail tobogganing, the Figaro moving walkway and the two moving walkways in the French Ski School (ESF) kids' snow club. This innovation, installed on the Tête des Saix chairlift, captures the hot air generated by the motor and will fulfil a remarkable feat: it will heat the chairlift's control and emergency rooms.

Clean ski areas

In Megève, 3 initiatives show that the ecological transition is underway: the electricity used for ski lifts, heating and lighting is 100% renewable. Grooming: new fuel made from recycled vegetable oils (80% lower emissions), including 1 hybrid fuel, adjustment of grooming (where appropriate) and ski lift speeds based on visitor numbers.

Praz de Lys Sommand organizes **2 waste collections** per year in the area, in partnership with Mountain Riders. **Saint-Gervais**, involved in the collaborative science initiative "Adopt'l spot", approved by the French Ministry for Ecological Transition, is committed to carrying out **2 collections a year for 3 years** in the same area (the top of the Mont d'Arbois cable car).

11 Flocon Vert (Green Snowflake) resorts

Châtel, Combloux, Cordon, Le Grand Bornand, Les Contamines-Montjoie, Megève, Morzine-Avoriaz, Passy, Vallée de Chamonix, Saint-Gervais have been awarded the label for their approach to progress and structuring of the ecological transition.







Hiking ranks 2nd among winter activities in Haute-Savoie, be it heading off on your own along marked trails or accompanied by aficionados. An opportunity for non-skiers to experience the joys of snow and for skiers to vary their winter pleasures.

Sunrise over Mont-Blanc in Cordon

To be the first on Mont-Blanc's balcony, the rendezvous is set for 6am to weave your way through the snow and watch the sunrise with snowshoes on your feet!

Bénés Plateau offers a 360° panoramic vista over **Pointe Percée, the Fiz mountains, Aiguille Verte** and the Mont-Blanc range of mountains.

At dusk in the Alpes du Léman

Accompanied by a mountain guide, this hike will take you to the Hirmentaz crests, where you can admire the sunset between Mont-Blanc and **Lake Geneva**. Another experience, a trend: light-painting hiking.

Under a full moon in Salève

A 2-hour stroll through snow-covered mountain pastures and glades with uninterrupted views, returning under the stars.

Encountering Alpine ibex in Le Grand-Bornand

An early morning excursion of around 3 hours on the slopes of the **Colombière Pass**, observing the animal through a field-glass, with explanations from the guide about its way of life. Informative and invigorating.

Birds'-eye view over Lake Geneva from the crests

The Mémises crest route is the iconic marked trail through **Léman Mountains Explore** territory, between Mémises Peak and the vast Lake
Geneva

Bout du Monde (Edge of the World) in the Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval

This charming 7 km walk, deep in the heart of the Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval, France's second largest cirque, is captivating.

With your dog: snowshoe-hiking with dogs

A one-of-a-kind experience in the **Môle & Brasses** area, awarded the Toutourisme label (pet-friendly areas), with a guide and a photographer to capture the memories.

Snowshoes + fondue: it gets you going!

Your steps get lighter when there's a treat waiting at the end. Most Haute-Savoie resorts invite you to enjoy this après-ski that combines initiatory discoveries and gourmet delights, for example, in an igloo on the Plaine-Joux Plateau (Môle & Brasses), in a yurt in Morillon, inside the trapper's Teepee in La Clusaz (new), in the Caban'igloo in Bernex, Teepee in Cordon and in Les Carroz, etc.

100% snowshoe break

- •L'Escapade blanche (the white getaway) in the Alpes du Léman: 2 days/2 nights of discovery across white realms in the Chablais Global Geopark
- L'appel de la forêt (the call of the forest) on the Plaine-Joux Plateau, 2 days/1 night in an igloo (built by participants).

Worth noting: the Snowshoeing Festival (all over France) in January - TSL Outdoor, leader in making snowshoes is based in Haute-Savoie (Annecy).







Far North atmosphere

Two amazing experience: a fondue and/or a night in an igloo in the Alpes du Léman or above Lake Annecy, in a yurt in Morillon or in a teepee in Cordon, La Clusaz or Les Carroz (with the legendary "log-splitter) deep in the forest. Snowshoeing with a mountain guide following animal tracks is a must to spice up your sports holiday, in particular with children (an outing made even better with marshmallows toasted on a wood fire, lit by little trappers).

Micro-adventures

Bivouacking in winter: a one-of-a-kind experience, but you need to be well prepared and well accompanied. This is the frosty thrill that a mountain guide offers in the Chablais: 2 days of snowshoeing, a night in a tent and a vista over Mont-Blanc when you wake up.

Winter adventure racing: an out-of-the-ordinary 3-day getaway, like a moment out of time, in Samoëns, that combines adventure, basic comfort and total immersion in the mountains. A survival adventure course and a night in an igloo that you build yourself or a night in an expedition teepee.

White trail running

With its mountain ranges and its never-ending high-altitude routes, Haute-Savoie is perfect for trail running. Areas that have been awarded the "Espaces Trail"* label (Trail Spaces) illustrate the great quality on offer locally. This is also seen through the host of events dedicated to this outdoor sporting discipline in its winter version.

Flaine, Les Carroz, Cluses Arve & montagnes, Morzine, Avoriaz, Praz de Lys Sommand.

Hitting the ice with style

Indulge in a "first time" that definitely won't leave you cold: quad-bike initiations on ice in **Flaine**, 600 m of thrilling, safe rides, ice climbing in the **Chablais** and **Haut-Giffre**, **dry tooling** in **Les Habères** (a new trendy discipline - a mix of ice climbing and climbing) and **ruisseling** in **Les Contamines-Montjoie**.

Fly high above the ski area

Another activity that's a must in winter: paragliding. In Thollon-les-Mémises, you'll cruise the skies between Lake Geneva and the mountains with the inventor of this discipline in France. In Passy, the resort founders will teach you how to spread your wings. In Les Contamines, the two-seater flight offers a breathtaking vista over Mont-Blanc. Worth noting: the Paragliding Test'ival in Samoëns, 4th edition from 4 to 6 April 2026. In Châtel, fly off along the Fantasticable, and, if ever you're in the **Alpes du Léman**, (Haute-Savoie's only gliding platform area), enjoy your first flight in a **glider** with a 360° vista over Lake Geneva, the Chablais Mountains and the Mont-Blanc range. For the real thrill-seekers among you, why not dare a **parachute jump** from a helicopter in Viuz-en-Sallaz.

Free-wheeling on the snow

Fat bike, mountain-biking on snow is a popular activity in Les Gets, across Salève and in Combloux.



Winter by the waterside



Cold water swimming: all the rage

Cold water swimming, inspired by Scandinavian traditions, is enjoying spectacular growth in France, particularly in **Morillon**, where a community of swimmers now exists. Cold water swimming, once considered as an extreme activity, is now one of the hottest **new sporting trends** and has many followers looking to boost their wellness and push their limits.

It has many benefits: it stimulates blood circulation, strengthens the immune system, increases calorie burning and releases endorphins.

In response to this trend, the **Cluses** Regional Scouts Swimming Club (CNSR Cluses) has launched a section devoted to this discipline and, for the past 2 years, has been organizing the **Défi du Lac Bleu** (Blue Lake Challenge), which takes place in a protected site at a height of 700 metres. The Blue Lake is special as it is supplied by a natural spring that gifts it with its **translucent water**. It is now their "daily training centre"!

Mid-March in **Morillon**, over 200 swimmers will swim in the cold waters of the Blue Lake: a thrilling scene! And for those who'd like to join in the adventure, everything is provided for, with **initiation sessions supervised** by professionals in the discipline.

SUP, even in winter

SUP also glides along icy waters in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc. Worth noting: **The Glagla Race** (17-18/01/2026), an extraordinary event that gathers together 900 sportive SUP fans on Lake Annecy.

Ice freediving, to wind down

This activity, open to anyone aged 18 and over, combines pushing your limits, serenity and sharing in a magical setting. **Montriond Lake** is an excellent place to take on this challenge, which is good for winding down and calming the mind day and night, as is **ice floating** for those who prefer to stay on the surface. **Ice freediving** is also available at **Confins Lake** from 5pm as a relaxing après-ski activity.



Zen moments in high-altitude lakes

Vallon Lake (Bellevaux), Plagnes Lake (Abondance), Green Lake (Passy), Vonnes Lake (Châtel), Lake Bénit (Mont-Saxonnex) are magnificent spots for strolling with your feet in the snow





Exquisite après-ski

Après-ski is an integral part of skiing holidays and part of the DNA of Haute-Savoie residents, who are as attached to thrills as they are to traditions: gathering to "baboler*" by the fireside during an evening gettogether, feet in the snow, enjoying a hot drink that smells of cinnamon or bubbles brewed by a local craft beer maker, or a piece of local PDO-PGI (AOP-IGP) cheese from a neighbouring producer. *chit-chat

To indulge in a deliciously "creamy" treat, nothing beats a visit to a farm at the end of the day, especially since in winter the second milking takes place around 5pm. A special moment to meet with farmers, some of whom are instructors during the day and, as such, foster their dual "naturalness" of sport and local produce. Later on, when it's time for the evening meal, all eyes are on regional specialities. And, while you're here, why not go for an aperitif suspended in the air on-board a ski lift (Grand Massif) or a fondue evening in an igloo or a teepee.

Festive après-ski


After-ski in **Avoriaz, Megève** and **Chamonix** often glides towards La Folie Douce, renowned for its great atmosphere and exclusive shows. The centre of **La Clusaz** village buzzes at night with its **festive places to be**. In **Les Gets**, night owls gather at L'Igloo Chalet Club, France's oldest nightclub (opened in 1938). For 3 years now, **Samoëns** has been hosting "Les Vignerons font du ski" (Winemakers go skiing) (save the date from 9 to 12 January 2026). A new vintage-style hangout is opening this winter in **Chamonix** as, at 11pm, the kitchen in the Pêle-mêle becomes a dance floor.

Seasonal events take centrestage across all the mountain ranges in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc. Arts on the slopes (**Passy**), Electro Snow (**Les Carroz**), Rock on Snow (**Avoriaz**), Radio Meuh Circus Festival (**La Clusaz**), Rock the Pistes (**Portes du Soleil**), Unlimited festival (**Chamonix**), etc.

Cultural après-ski

Why choose between two things that appeal: skiing and cultural? In Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc, you can have them both! Take **Saint-Gervais** for example, the Alpine resort that nurtures its cultural appeal with 4 museums and Baroquestyle churches, considered as jewels.

In the Valley, and because Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc is not just a skiing destination, enthusiasts and connoisseurs are spoilt for choice with **10 performance venues**, including a national theatre, **68** museums, **61** classified monuments and **142** listed monuments, open to visitors all year round.



Revitalizing pleasures

Thermal bath & spa therapy: age-old tradition

For centuries, Haute-Savoie has drawn on its natural springs as a source of health benefits. From **Thonon-les-Bains** to **Saint-Gervais-les-Bains**, and on to **Évian-les-Bains**, the region's thermal centres offer their **virtue-giving pure waters** to spa guests and hedonists staying over (mini treatment breaks and spa packages). We love: **Saint-Gervais Thermal Baths' ski and spa package: 4h skiing and 3h in the spa.**

Head to the spa for a revitalizing après-ski

If you wish to take pamper your body and/or wind down, Haute-Savoie overflows with places where balance and harmony take centrestage: secluded spas nestling in a mountain village, cosy hammams and jacuzzis facing the peaks, outdoor Nordic baths under the stars, treatments inspired by local resources (Alpine plants, spring water, essential oils, etc.) covering 4,000 m²: the QC Spa of Wonders is the largest in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc. In addition to 4 and 5* hotel spas, a host of resorts have their own wellness centres: Le Palais (Megève), Aquacîme (Les Carroz), Forme d'O (Châtel), Aquariaz (Avoriaz), Les Sources du Chéry (Les Gets). In the Valley, Vitam (Neydens) and the Sallanches wellness centre also offer regenerating amenities.

New: Ski & Spa and Aperitif Spa packages in Les Contamines-Montjoie, at the gateway to the nature reserve, a stone's throw from the Nordic area and snowshoeing trails.

Wellness in the great outdoors

In Haute-Savoie, wellness is also to be enjoyed in the great outdoors and nature inspires gentle yet intense approaches: "toumo" cold yoga (Le Grand-Bornand, Samoëns, Saint-Sigismond), and full awareness skiing in Samoëns, cold water swimming and sauna combo in Morillon, meditation in the forest, snowshoeing and yoga in the Chablais, outdoor yoga course in Flaine, winter retreat at the heart of the Alpes du Léman, etc.









The cultural appeal of ski resorts

With its 4 museums, Saint-Gervais, the Alpine resort proves that its beautiful and culturally rich. The old Maison Forte de Hautetour hosts renowned temporary exhibitions and a permanent exhibition dedicated to mountaineering and the history of the Compagnie des Guides (mountain guide association), founded 161 years ago.

La Cure is a cultural centre offering visitors the opportunity to discover the heritage of the municipality through a programme of temporary exhibitions, guided tours and workshops. Pile Pont Expo, dedicated to contemporary art. The Sacred Art Museum is a jewel that nestles in Saint-Nicolas de Véroce, a picturesque little village at the foot of Mont-Blanc. It houses the Treasure of Saint Nicolas and tells the story of the village and its famous peddlers.

New: in Les Contamines-Montjoie, close to the natural and cultural site of Notre-Dame de la Gorge, an old inn is getting ready to write another chapter in its history this winter. This new space will blend gastronomy, history and culture, and will place the spotlight on Baroque art.

Traditional and architectural design

Architecture is at the forefront in **Flaine**. Acclaimed as France's most iconic avant-garde ski resort when it opened (1968) and classified as a 20th-century heritage site, **Flaine** stands out for its one-of-a-kind architecture imagined by Marcel Breuer, Bauhaus professor. The resort is listed under French "Historic Monuments" for its ecumenical chapel. **Flaine** is an open-air museum, the only resort in the world to exhibit permanent monumental and architectural works (**Dubuffet's "Le Boqueteau des 7 Arbres" (The Copse of 7 Trees)**, **Picasso's "Tête de Femme" (Head of a Woman)**, **Vasarely's "Les Trois Hexagones" (The Three Hexagons)**, etc.).

Churches: sacred art treasures

Every Haute-Savoie village and town has its own steeple, style and era. **Annecy** boasts 27 religious buildings, including the **Cathedral** and a **basilica** (La Visitation).

Baroque churches, real **decorative treasures**, bear witness to **ancestral know-how** and mountain art. The Baroque Getaway in the Alps is more than just an adventure, it's a journey through time and artistic aesthetics. **The Church of Saint Nicolas in Véroce** is a real gem, with its interior dazzling with "Saint Nicolas blue" colours, gilding and cherubs. The **Church of Cordon**, also in the Pays du Mont-Blanc, deserves attention as sensory tours have become a sensation. The **Church of Saint-Maurice in Thônes** and its listed Savoyard Baroque altarpiece dating from the 17-18th century.

Worth noting: the largest organ in Haute-Savoie reigns in the Le Grand-Bornand Church (11 tons, with 40 stops and 3,500 pipes, created by organ builder Michel Giroud, who worked on it from 1986 to 1988).

68 interactive museums

Haute-Savoie's museums and themed establishments showcase local art, crafts and history through collections illustrating Alpine life, traditional know-how and the creativity of the department's artists. The **new Mont-Blanc Museum** is expected to open in March 2026. The expansion (600 to 1,800 m²) and total renovation of the **old Alpine Museum**, set up in 1926 in the historic former **"Chamonix Palace"**, has enabled the creation of three permanent and temporary exhibition spaces, a room dedicated to educational workshops, a gift shop adjacent to the reception area, unpacking spaces, a workshop and/ or storage space for the works. The scenography has been entirely revamped to make it more attractive (new museography, new mediation tools, etc.) and showcase the **15,000 works and objects depicting the historical and artistic heritage of the Mont-Blanc region**.

The **Hameau des Alpes (La Clusaz)** (Hamlet of the Alps) and the **Musée du Ski Ancien (La Chapelle d'Abondance)** (Museum of Skiing in the Past) are great places to learn about the history of skiing, which is a key part of Haute-Savoie's identity.

Medieval heritage

Medieval heritage can be felt everywhere, between places of remembrance and buildings steeped in history. The Middle Ages saw the emergence and development of **abbeys** (Abondance, Sixt, Entremont, Saint-Jean-d'Aulps) and **Carthusian monasteries** (Mélan and Le Reposoir). These listed monuments bear witness to Haute-Savoie's thousand-year-old sacred history; busy places (except for Le Carmel in Le Reposoir) with a programme of activities, tours and workshops.

Here are **3 medieval villages** to discover that bear witness to the Middle Ages: **Yvoire** on the shores of Lake Geneva (Most Beautiful Village in France), **Alby-sur-Chéran** nestling in its haven on the banks of the Chéran between Annecy and Rumilly, and **La Roche-sur-Foron**, at the heart and intersection of all the "routes" of Haute-Savoie.

Castle life

From the banks of Lake Geneva to the foothills of the Alps, Haute-Savoie unveils its collection of castles. Each visit becomes a journey through history and time. Château de Ripaille(Thonon) enchants with its glorious past and its noble vineyard. Château de Thorens (Fillière), birthplace of Saint Francis de Sales, embodies the region's spiritual memory. Château de Menthon-Saint-Bernard, proudly reigning on the hillside over Lake Annecy. looks like it has come straight out of a fairy tale (Walt Disney was inspired by it for Sleeping Beauty's castle and, during the festive season, it becomes Santa Claus's home). Château **de Montrottier**, perched on its hilltop, with its dungeon and its round towers, is the epitome of a medieval castle and houses the intriguing cabinets of curiosities of its last owner. Château d'Annecy, which is visible from the old town, is now a museum: it hosts temporary and permanent exhibitions (contemporary art, Observatory of Alpine Lakes). Clermont, Avully, Sires du Faucigny are three other must-visit treasures. As for the Château des Rubins and Château de Sonnaz, which have been converted into cultural spaces, they are perfect for pursuing your immersion in Alpine culture.

The tradition of moments from days gone by!

Ecomuseums and heritage centres give pride of place to skills and techniques of yesteryear. In the Ecomuseum of Lake Annecy (Sevrier), Musée Paysan (Rural Museum) (Viuz-en-Sallaz) and the Musée Montagnard (Mountain Museum) (Les Houches), village life is centre staged.

Le Grand-Bornand's Heritage Centre, an authentic listed farmhouse from 1830, you'll be immersed in the daily lives of locals from days of yore.

Château de Ripaille

One of the grandest residences on the French shore of Lake Geneva. The site, which dates back to medieval times, is now a rare portrayal of life in 1900. October half-term holidays: special tours from Tuesday to Friday (tours of areas that are usually closed, with different themes) and the castle will be decorated in Halloween style throughout the holidays, with on the agenda: Escape Game >> how to escape from the castle (24 and 25 October - 6.30pm to 10pm).

Special Haunted House for Halloween, 31 October.

Murder Party - 1st November from 2pm to 5pm.

Santa's Hamlet/Grand Parc d'Andilly

In Santa Claus's house (open all year round), the atmosphere is totally green and red, and the scent of wood fills the air, right down to the toy-making workshop. The big man is very busy, but he sometimes lets himself be seen by curious little ones who wander through the rooms and corridors of this enchanted house where magic awaits behind every door. To be swept away by the enchantment of the moment, Mrs. Claus's den is a true haven of delight. All day long, Santa's sisters tell stories and whisper in the ears of young and old dreamers alike. Five minutes from the Hamlet, the enchantment continues deep in the heart of the Grand Parc d'Andilly forest, where you can visit the Kingdom of the Nutcrackers, Father Whipper's House, Father Gourmet's Palace, as well as carousels and tree-top adventure courses, etc.

Montenvers Train

An immersion that invites you to delight in **outstanding vistas over the prestigious peaks of the Drus and the Grandes Jorasses from Chamonix-Mont-Blanc station.**Twenty minutes and 870 metres of elevation gain later, you'll discover the **Mer de Glace**, the largest glacier in France.

The Mechanical Music Museum

This place, at the heart of Les Gets resort and the only one of its kind in Europe, showcases 900 instruments, including some that date back to the 17th century, all in working order. The museum's prestigious collection also includes the Aeolian Philharmonic Organ, listed as a historic monument, the automatons of the famous perfumer Roger & Gallet and, an exceptional new addition, Pablo Picasso's mechanical piano, which joined the collection this summer after being restored.

Mont-Blanc Tramway

Mont-Blanc Tramway, or TMB as it's known here, leaves from Le Fayet (580 m) and arrives at the Nid d'Aigle (2,372 m) after covering a distance of 12.4 km. It takes mountaineers to the start of the Mont-Blanc ascent via the Royal Route, and offers those who enjoy contemplation and families the opportunity to experience the majestic scenery of the high mountains safely.

Designation cheeses, traditional savoury and sweet delicacies... These products from Haute-Savoie are signatures of the region and real values cherished by those that live there. These typical dishes are "the spice of the journey" and warm up winter!

In the land of PDO (AOP) cheeses

6 designations of excellence in Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc: AOP Abondance, AOP Chevrotin, AOP Beaufort, AOP Raclette de Savoie, AOP Reblochon, AOP Tome des Bauges.

Thônes and the Aravis, home of farmhouse Reblochon
Probably the best known Alpine cheese, to be enjoyed on a
cheese platter or melted in a Reblochonnade version. It can be
found in all the restaurants in the villages and on the heights in
the Aravis, from Thônes to Le Grand-Bornand, from La Clusaz to
Saint-Jean-de-Sixt, as well as in Manigod.



Abondance Valley, home of AOP Abondance and the "Berthoud STG"

To really enjoy this signature cheese, you need to try several different maturities, and also try it melted, as in Berthoud TSG, a typical dish from the Chablais area, created in the early 20th century at the Cercle Républicain (a bistro in Thononles-Bains, run by the Berthoud family). It is cooked with garlic, white wine, pepper and nutmeg and was the 1st recipe in France to be protected by the official quality label: "Spécialité Traditionnelle Garantie (STG)" (Traditional Speciality Guaranteed (TSG)).

Other tempting delights: at **Les Sources** du Lac d'Annecy, you can taste "matouille" (Tome des Bauges cheese, white wine, garlic and potatoes), and in Megève you can enjoy a fondue with fruit prepared by an expert cheesemaker or while riding in a horse-drawn carriage (totally one of a kind).

Behind the production scenes

Farming runs through the veins in Haute-Savoie. A tour during milking time: an activity with an added bonus, meeting passionate producers, who embody the spirit of Haute-Savoie Mont-Blanc.

Sweet treats

Glaçons de Megève®. When Barthélémy Vigliengo created this meringue praline bite in 1910, he was far from imagining that Megève would still be enjoying it 110 years later.

BearClaws.In Mont-Saxonnex this cream-filled Viennese pastry has been a signature sweet treat for almost 40 years.

The unbeatable wild blueberry tart (harvested/picked in the mountain pastures in summer) to indulge in on the slopes with your feet in the snow.

Savoury dishes & delights

"Farcement" or "farçon (Chamonix Valley), also known as "rabolet" (Mont-Saxonnex): halfway between savoury and sweet, made with potatoes, prunes (or dried fruit) and smoked bacon (or lard). This must-do, traditional Sunday lunch dish was cooked on the hearth and eaten by all the family when they came home from church.

Potato fritters: these grated potatoes, iconic in the region, can be topped with a variety of ingredients, herbs, cheeses, mushrooms, as wished; the ones served on **Glières Plateau** are highly-acclaimed as are the ones from **Morillon** and those from **Les Gets**, known as **"rapins"**.

"Bescoin": this golden-yellow brioche bread is a speciality from the Arve Valley, traditionally made for summer village celebrations called "vogues" and, in bygone days, was made and blessed by the local priest every 15 August.

"Soupe Châtrée" ("chastened" soup) from Haut-Giffre: a hearty, rural speciality based on bread, Tomme de Savoie cheese and onions, gratinated with broth.

But, there's more...

Ravioles in Les Carroz d'Arâches, while fish reigns on the table on the shores of Lake Annecy and Lake Geneva and "Contaminard" (bread) in Les Contamines-Montjoie.

"Diot"-polenta ("polente"): a "diot" (local dialect word for a sausage) is much more than just a sausage, it's a symbol of hospitality and Alpine culinary tradition. Whether plain, smoked or with Beaufort cheese, "diots" are a must on every table in the




